## Curriculum over view:

<b>English</b>	The children will be planning & writing a story based on the book The Tiger Who Came to Tea. Our author of the week is Judith Kerr so please visit the library to read more of her books or help your child research facts about this author.
<b>Maths</b>	We will be focusing on number & place value.
<b>Science</b>	This half term our theme will be People and their Pets (Animals Inc Humans). This week pupils will use the school grounds to observe creatures.
<b>Topic</b>	This term our topic is Our Country and the Local Area. This week pupils will understand geographical similarities and differences through studying human and physical geography in the context of the UK.
<b>Music</b>	We will be practising songs for our Harvest festival & learning the class prayer. We will also focus on the theme Ourselves - Creating and responding to vocal sounds and body percussion.
<b>RE</b>	Our theme this half term is Families. The children will be learning about the importance of family & share experiences of their own family. <b>Please send in a family photo by next Monday.</b>
<b>Computing</b>	Pupils will use technology purposefully to create and organise digital content by opening and closing programs independently and correctly.
<b>PSHE</b>	Our theme this half term is Me and My School. This week the children will learn about the school council and will be voting for class representatives.
<b>PE</b>	During the autumn term the children will be doing multi-skills on a Tuesday and dance on a Thursday.
