Curriculum over view:

English	The children will be planning & writing a story based on the book Whatever Next. Our author of the week is Jill Murphy so please visit the library to read more of her books or help your child research facts about this author.
Maths	We will be focusing on number & place value.
Science	This half term our theme is People and their Pets (Animals Inc Humans). This week pupils will focus on the question - where do woodlice like living?
Topic	This term our topic is Our Country and the Local Area. This week pupils will discuss aerial photographs and use a journey line.
Music	We will be practising songs for our Harvest festival.
RE	Our theme this half term is Families. The children will be learning about the importance of family & share experiences of their own family. Children will need a family photo on Monday.
Computing	Pupils will use programs to identify basic data types.
PSHE	Our theme this half term is Me and My School. This week the children will learn how a class council works.
PE	During the autumn term the children will be doing multi-skills on a Tuesday and dance on a Thursday.
