Curriculum over view:

English	The children will be planning & writing a story based on the book <i>The Tiger Who Came to Tea</i> . Our author of the week is Judith Kerr so please visit the library to read more of her books or help your child research facts about this author.
Maths	Y1: Place value within 10 Y2: Place Value
Science	This half term our theme will be People and their Pets (Animals Inc Humans). This week pupils will focus on the basic needs for animals including humans.
Topic	This term our topic is Our Country and the Local Area. Look at a map of the UK at home and identify the four nations and capital cities. Talk about places you have visited.
Art	To explore line and mark making to draw water
Music	Listen and appraise - Mbube by Soweto gospel choir (South African style). Finding the pulse using our body and learning the song Hands, Feet, Heart.
RE	Our theme this half term is What do Christians believe God is like?
Computing	To become familiar with the types of resources available in the Topics section of Purple Mash.
RSE	Our theme this half term is Me and My School.
PE	The children will be doing dance on a Tuesday and multi-skills on a Thursday.
